14 TH ANNUAL CAMPFIRE

Held at Union Lake Park, In
Millville.

Although it started off with stormy weather the 14th annual camp fire of the Ladies of the G. A. R. held at Union Lake Park in Millville yesterday proved a great success and with clearing weather at noon many visitors came in on the afternoon trains and trolley cars. These campfires are an annual event in which all the ladies from all over South Jersey take part and yesterday there were parties from Vineland, Bridgeton, Millville, Port Norris, Rosenhayn, Cedarville, Cape May, Leesburg and Maurice town. The big park was crowded in the afternoon and evening and many people in the city went up to attend the exercises. Early in the morning notwithstanding the pouring rain, the people began to come to Millville and at once made their way to the park. Here many soon gathered and at 9 o'clock the campfire was lit with appropriate responsive ceremonies.

Wheat, of Millville, officer of the day. Dinner was served at 12 o'clock and a large number sat down to the festal Board.

The committee of arrangements, consisting of Mrs. Sara E. Wallen, of Millville; Mrs. Charles Atkinson, of Vineland, and Mrs. Ruth Bennett, of Bridgeton, had looked well after everything and the programme went off easily and without a break. All of the officers of the past year were present, consisting of the president, Mrs. Samuet Leatherwood, of Millville; vice president, Mrs. Victoria Herbert, of Vineland; secretary, Mrs. Emma Vandegrift, of Bridgeton, and treasurer, Mrs. Mary Rogers, of Vineland. There are only three of these lodges connected with the G. A. R. in South Jersey but they take in all of the territory below Camden. They comprise Fraternity and Loyalty Circle No. 5, of Millville, U. S. Grant Circle, No. 12, of Vineland, and Glenwood Circle of Bridgeton.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Camp Fire reconvened at 2 o'clock in the Casino, where addresses were delivered by L. Babcock, of Vineland, State junior vice president of the G. A. R.; A. L. Winans, of Millville; Adjutant General Purvis, of Rosenhayn, and Mrs. Fox, a former army nurse in the Civil War. All the addresses were good and were loudly applauded. During the session Miss Lizzie Wallen also favored with a humorous recitation. The ladies then went into executive session and elected the following officers for the coming year: President, Mrs. Ella Robinson, of Bridgeton; secretary, Mrs. Achenbach, of Vineland; treasurer, Mrs. Jennie Benson, of Millville.

The dress parade was an interesting event and took place at 4 o'clock, in which the ladies took part with the men and gave a very creditable exhibition. In the evening a large number of Millville people joined with the G. A. R. ladies and attended a fine moving picture show in the park casino, which was soon transformed into a dance hall after the show was over, where the young people enjoyed themselves until late in the evening.
